



Cambridge University Cricket Club Privacy Notice Statement

This statement explains how Cambridge University Cricket Club (“CUCC”, “we”, “us” and “our”) handles and uses the personal information we collect about our members and officials for processes relating to our operations and activities.

When changes are made to this statement, we will publish the updated version on our website.

The controller for your personal information is Cambridge University Cricket Club. The person responsible for data protection within our society is the Club Secretary who can be contacted at hyde.anthony@ntlworld.com.

How We Use Your Personal Information

We collect and process your personal information for a number of purposes, including:

- Membership and general administration.
 - For Playing Members, this includes match/league registration, team sheets, health and safety risk assessment, and emergency contact details.
- Providing the services you request from us.
- Communicating with you.
- Record keeping purposes.
- Carrying out market research so that we can improve the services we offer.
- Tracking and analysing activity on our website (via cookies).

How We Share Your Personal Information

We share some of your personal information with the University, only where there is a specific need to, including:

- For registration as a University Sports Club or with competition leagues (e.g. BUCS)
- For insurance purposes.
- To provide your Full/Half Blues.
- Sporting records for your University records.
- For alumni communications and/or fundraising purposes specifically related to CUCC.

We share some of your personal information with the email distribution software ‘MailChimp’ for the purposes of sending out club-related emails.

We use University IT facilities to store electronic copies of personal information.

We may be subject to a legal requirement (with or without your consent) to share your personal information with the University or a government agency (such as the police or security services or other statutory authorities with investigatory powers) under special circumstances (e.g. relating to tax, crime or health and safety). Where feasible and appropriate, we will notify you of our intention to share such information in advance.

Your Rights

You have the right to access the personal information that we hold about you. You also have the right to ask us to correct any inaccurate personal information we hold about you, to delete personal information, or otherwise restrict our processing, or to object to processing or communications, or to receive an electronic copy of the personal information you provided to us. Please note that all of these rights are qualified in various ways.

If you have questions or concerns about how your personal information is used, please contact us using the above details.

If you remain unhappy with the way your information is being handled, or with the response received from us, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office at Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, SK9 5AF (<https://ico.org.uk/>).
